"My dogs are my family. My son grew up with them and they were there for me providing emotional support throughout my pregnancy and domestic violence situation."

"My cat means everything to me. Since my husband passed away, my cat has been my best friend. She talks to me when I walk in the door and when I wake up. She cuddles up next to me on my bed. I can't imagine my life without her."

"My dog is my everything. I love him so much and he has given me love, hope, and strength throughout everything I have been through. We have never been apart, even through my worst times. He is my world."



Pawster is about **people** and **pets**.

When we launched Pawster in 2020, Pawster's board wanted to help animals. Crisis Foster Care is a way to keep pets out of shelters, so fewer animals will die due to overcrowding. Pawster is a proud network partner of Best Friends Animal Society, working to achieve the goal of "No Kill 2025."

But at the time, we didn't fully realize the impact Crisis Foster Care has on people.

Last year, I spoke with a man who came into the emergency room and desperately needed medical treatment. He had left his dog at a motel unattended, and the motel staff was going to surrender the dog to the shelter. "I can't live without my dog," he said. If we didn't find someone to care for his dog, he was going to leave the hospital and forego the vital health care he needed.

By caring for his dog, a volunteer Pawster Foster not only saved the dog's life — they also allowed this man to access the resources he needed to come home to his dog healthy.

In 2023, we cared for 100 animals while their families recovered from crisis — more than ever before. But we received 334 requests for foster care. With your help, we will continue building capacity to reach our goal of caring for at least 65% of foster requests for by 2025.





Total: **\$140,293**


2023 Expenses
